#### Dystopia


- An imagined world or society in which people lead wretched, dehumanized and fearful lives;

- The term refers to Greek expression "dis topos" which means "bad place";





## Traits of a dystopian YA setting

- Post-cataclysmic or post-apocalyptic world;
- Lack of individuality;
- Advanced technological progress;
- Control imposed via physical control, propaganda, restriction of space people live in, psychological or even technological control;
- The society is an illusion of utopian world;
- Citizens are under constant surveillance of the government;

## Features of a dystopian rebel)





#### The rebel usually:

- Tries to deal with the main conflict of the novel;
- Is heavily invested in political objectives of the story;
  - Is a teenager between the age of 12-18;

- Questions the existing social and political system or regime;
- Exhibits behaviour that starts more widespread opposition against the state;
- Struggles against the odds and expectations put on their age and gender;



#### Katniss Everdeen

- rebellious family background;
- a tendency to defy authority;
- noble qualities she is strong, courageous, but also compassionate;
- takes on responsibilities of typically "male" protagonists;
- draws logical conclusions based on knowledge from her world;
